ADDITIONS

Para 4.5.1

Work details will be posted by committee chairmen and/or Officers in lower clubhouse and completed work and hours must be verified and signed by the chairman of the event, by a member of the Board of Directors or by an officer of the club.

5.1 Committee Appointment

The President and / or Board of Directors shall determine and / or appoint the appropriate committees at the beginning of the each calendar year or as required through out the calendar year and said committees shall organize within ten (10) days or as soon as possible thereafter.

5.2 Committee Funding

Committee chairmen will prepare an estimated budget for their respective committee. This budget will be presented to the membership for approval. In lieu of a budget, money spent by a Committee must be approved in advance by the Board of Directors or by a vote at a meeting of the membership.

5.3 Committee Reporting

Said appointed committees / committee chairmen shall provide reports on their respective committee progress at monthly General Membership meetings or at scheduled Board of Director meetings. Reports received by the Board of Directors will be provided to the General Membership at the next General Membership meeting. The Board of Directors will determine from these reports the need and effectiveness of each committee.

Para 8.3

Notice of Special meeting must be posted on the Club web site and sent via email to members no less than 72 hours before said Special meeting.

Para 9.1

The Secretary will insure member notification of proposed By-Law changes at least twenty eight (28) days prior to the meeting at which the change will be presented for a vote of approval.

DELETIONS

Para 4.6

Out of county members, except those members who joined prior to January 1, 2001, shall have their dues increased by \$50.00.

5.1. Field Committee

The President shall appoint a Chairman(s) of the Field Committee. The Chairman(s) will choose members for the Field Committee and sub committees thereof. The Committee shall be responsible for providing lands for the membership for the purpose of shooting, hunting, fishing, trapping and other out door activities. The Field Committee shall be responsible to organize and sponsor competitive and sporting events.

5.2. House Committee

The President shall appoint a Chairman(s) of the House Committee. The Chairman(s) will choose members for the House Committee and sub committees thereof. The Committee shall be responsible for the facilities of the Club. The House Committee is responsible for promoting sportsmanship and hunter safety. It is also responsible to organize and sponsor fund raising activities for the Club.

5.3. Field and House Rules

The Field Committee and the House Committee shall draft rules to govern the members on the field and in the Clubhouse that shall be acceptable and approved by a two thirds (2/3) vote of the regular members present at a regular or special meeting of the Club.

5.4 Committee Funding

Money spent in excess of \$50 by a Committee must be approved in advance by the Board of Directors or by a vote at a meeting of the membership.

5.5. When Committees are Appointed

The President shall appoint these committees at the beginning of the calendar year and said committees shall organize within ten (10) days and as soon as possible thereafter.

5.6. Finance Committee

There shall be a Finance Committee made up of all elected Officers of the Club. This Committee shall submit an annual budget and shall have the power to veto any spending proposals passed by the membership if two thirds (2/3) of the Finance Committee agrees on the veto.

CHANGES

Para 2.2

Every two (2) years the President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer will be elected to two (2) year terms with their terms expiring in the odd number year. The nine (9) Directors will also serve two (2) year terms with their terms expiring in the even number year.

TO

Every two (2) years the President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer will be elected to two (2) year terms with their terms expiring in the odd number years. The Directors will also serve two (2) year terms with four directors term expiring in the odd years and five directors term expiring in the even years.

Para 2.2.4

The Chairperson shall be chosen from the 9 elected director positions for a one year term.

TO

The Chairperson shall be chosen from the 9 elected director positions and the secretary and treasurer for a one year term.

Para 3.4

He shall send all notices, publish newsletters and perform any other duties pertaining to his office.

TO

He shall send all correspondence, notices, oversee newsletter publication, and perform any other duties pertaining to his office.

Para 3.5

The Board of Directors has the power to discharge an incumbent Officer or Director based on the Nominating Committees performance review. The Board is responsible to see that all of the rules of the Field Committee and House Committee are complied with for the safety of the members and shall act with both the House and Field Committees to insure the enforcement of all rules and laws. The Board of Directors shall serve as the Finance Committee.

TO

The Board of Directors by majority vote has the power to discharge an incumbent or sitting Officer or Director based on that Officer/Director's performance. The Board is responsible to see that all of the rules of the Club are complied with for the safety of the members and shall insure the enforcement of all rules and laws. The Board of Directors shall review Club finances on a regular basis and make any required recommendations to the membership. The Board of Directors shall prepare an annual budget and shall have the power to veto any spending proposals passed by the membership, if two thirds (2/3) of the Board of Directors present agrees on the veto.

Para 4.1

Members who are not residents of Columbia County (voting address) cannot comprise a majority on the board of directors during the annual election or during any meeting when a vote on club business occurs.

Members who are not residents of Columbia County (voting address) cannot comprise a majority on the board of directors or during any meeting when a vote on club business occurs.

Para 4.2.1

Regular members include Junior Regular Members.

TO

Regular members shall include Junior Members.

Para 4.3

The number of regular members shall be limited to two hundred (250) excluding active exempt (life) members. The regular member ceiling may be exceeded as described in Section 4.8.

TO

The number of regular members shall be limited to two hundred (250) excluding active exempt (life) members and Junior members.

Para 4.6

The dues of regular members shall be determined by the Finance Committee. The dues should be calculated by dividing the Club's proposed operating expenses by the number of dues paying members. Operating expenses shall be those expenses directly attributed to the maintenance and ownership of Club lands and property, including but not limited to, county and school taxes, income taxes, insurance premiums and utility bills as determined by the Finance Committee.

Dues for members aged twelve (12) to fourteen (14) years of age shall be \$20.
Dues for members aged fifteen (15) to seventeen (17) years of age shall be \$35.

Upon annual written request, the dues of a regular member who is a full time college student or who is an active member of the armed forces during his first enlistment shall be waived.

The dues of a social member shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00) less than a regular member's dues.
The dues of regular members shall be determined by the Finance Committee.

TO

The dues of regular members shall be determined by the Board of Directors. The dues should be calculated by dividing the Club's proposed operating expenses by the number of dues paying members.

Operating expenses shall be those expenses directly attributed to the maintenance and ownership of Club lands and property, including but not limited to, county and school taxes, income taxes, insurance premiums and utility bills as determined by the Board of Directors.

Dues for members aged twelve (12) to thirteen (13) years of age shall be free.
Dues for members aged fourteen (14) to seventeen (17) years of age shall be \$30.

Upon annual written request, the dues of a regular member who is a tuition paying full time post-secondary student or who is an active member of the armed forces during his first enlistment shall be waived.

The dues of a social member shall be twenty five dollars (\$25.00) less than a regular member's dues.

Para 4.7

The initiation fee for a regular member shall be determined upon yearly review by the Finance Committee.

The initiation fee for a regular member shall be determined upon yearly review by the Board of Directors. All new members after xx/xx/2009 shall be required to purchase two (2) club bonds as part of their initiation requirement.

Para 4.10

If all bonds in the terminated member's name are not redeemed within ninety (90) days, the bonds shall revert to the treasury of the Club.

If all bonds in the terminated or deceased member's name are not redeemed within ninety (90) days, the bonds shall revert to the treasury of the Club.

7.2. Raffle Tickets

Raffle ticket money must be turned in prior to the date of the raffle or the member receiving same will be assessed the amount of the ticketst on the next year's dues. Failure to pay the assessment will result in removal from the Club. Each member, except life members and junior members, must sell a minimum of \$20.00 worth of raffle tickets for the year to satisfy the yearly requirement.

Raffle money must be turned in prior to the date of the raffle or the member receiving same will be assessed the amount of the raffle on the next year's dues. Failure to pay the assessment will result in removal from the Club. Each member, except life members and junior members, must sell a minimum of \$20.00 for the year to satisfy the yearly requirement.
